

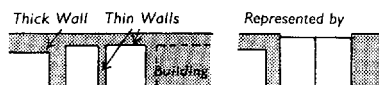

Walls which are in excess of these widths are shown by two lines, each representing one face. For roofed buildings, the lines on the plan normally represent the outer face of the walls at ground level.
